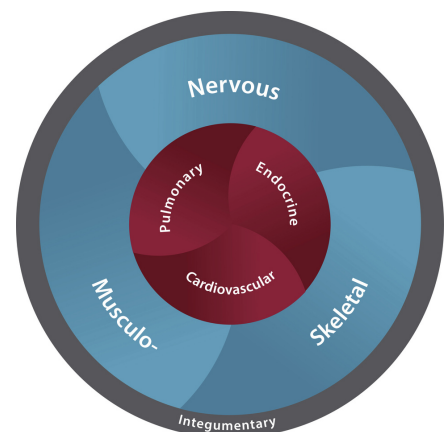

Faculty Speaker

Beth E. Crowner PT, DPT, NCS, MPPA is a Professor of Physical Therapy at Washington University in St. Louis with a secondary appointment in the Department of Neurology. Dr. Crowner contributes to the educational missions of the Program in Physical Therapy by lecturing and leading laboratory experiences in neurologic assessment and treatment and teaching content on professional issues, management, and administration. She previously served as the Division Director of the Clinical Practice growing the clinical services from one to four sites, creating expanded access to physical therapy in the community, and growing opportunities for clinical education for students in the Program. She maintains a clinical practice with an emphasis on treating individuals with mobility deficits due to varied neurologic conditions including a focus on Parkinson's disease and other movement disorders. Dr. Crowner has served in various leadership roles within the Academy of Neurologic Physical Therapy within the American Physical Therapy Association. Most recently, she served on the Board of Directors as the first Director of Practice. In this role, she oversaw developed processes to enhance evidence-based practice by developing infrastructure for the creation of clinical practice guidelines as well as processes for translating knowledge from the guidelines into clinical practice. Dr. Crowner has been invited to speak both locally and nationally on the topics of knowledge translation and neurologic rehabilitation. Dr. Crowner enjoys running, hiking, playing tennis, and woodworking. Most importantly, she relishes time spent with her husband, three sons, and two (at times muddy) golden retrievers.
